## May we all renew our faith as our personal commitment to the Year of Faith.

Dear Catholic Faithful of the Gizo Diocese, The Holy Father has proclaimed 2013 a year of Faith in remembrance of the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Vatican II ecumenical Council. He also set up a new ministry at the Vatican for the “new evangelization” and he has called a Synod of Bishops to study the theme of “new evangelization”. We will soon have the document

We cannot love what we do not know... do you know your faith? How well do you know it?

**So here is the challenge of this year: let us know the faith better so we can love it more...**

- Since faith is first of all a Gift from above for each person, the growth in the faith and its renewal depends first of all in each person too... on the personal request and longing for the Gift (prayer) and on the personal response to that gift (commitment to live one's faith)
- St Thomas says that faith is a response of love and loyalty we give to God only upon receiving two graces from Him: the grace of Light (enlightenment) to see the truth we believe, and the grace of inner strength (courage) to be able to live what we see and put it into practice in our personal lives and daily behavior. Only God can remove the blindness of our doubts and give us the strength to live the demands of our faith so as to practice what we believe.

**Only God can make a believer**

So the main activity of this year must be

- First of all to ask God, individually and as a community, for the gift of a deeper and more personal and convinced faith. For this all the parishes of the three dioceses of Solomon Islands recite a daily prayer which has been distributed with the calendar and the Voice Catholica. Please pray this prayer after communion, in your parishes and villages every day together.
- After praying then we must learn more about our faith so we can appreciate it better. I appeal to the parish priests to take this effort of introducing and explain the catechism of the Catholic Church to the people through properly prepared youth and adult catechesis. We have plenty of bibles and catechesis books available in Gizo.
- Every month we will meditate together on some basic truths of our faith, share about these inspired truths in our Basic Christian Community meetings, and plan and try hard to live better and holier lives in our families, communities, ministries and services in our jobs

Then and only then our faith can be mature and “new”

### Peoples Motivation and Resources may Takeover Moli CHS.

"It will be a tough negotiation with the Choiseul Province Education Authority to take over St. Joseph Moli Community high School but we believe we can make it"

Speaking during gathering of the group of people more said that they are prepared to help the project, and to take over St. Joseph Moli Community High School depends much on the contribution of the parish, peoples motivation and their sources.

A concerned parent said that his parish must tolerate bishop's demand for enthusiasm and motivation of the people to takeover the school. Money alone cannot fulfill everybody's dream but along with our full heart for our children's right for education.

He ask his people not to be parasite but now to give our resources, manpower, logs, gravels and sands for free. He said that they are the luckiest people here in the Solomon Island that education is beside their door way.

### St. Peter's Urban Training School likely to Enroll Different Denomination

Priority to enroll for St. Peter's Urban Training Centre is for Catholics but more dropout students from other denominations shows interest to attend days school once they are accepted.

The training centre enroll dropout students from standard 6, secondary or even children who cannot complete either of those levels.

The school provides the following training for 2 years; Carpentry, Mechanic, Home Economy and Electrical.

### Family Life Coordinator Urge Parents to Take Responsibility.

Family Life Apostolate Coordinator urged parents to take responsibility, for their family. She reminds parents that most important in the family is to love, listen, respect and dialogue.

Sr. Rita op said that a Christian marriage and the family life are the basis for strong Christian communities. She reminds every wives and husbands the first vocation or a special call from God in the beginning when he created the whole universe.
