# TO MY COUNTRY BY ADOPTION



The whole Pacific region seems to be on high alert for our security deal with China. The news goes around the whole globe: the Solomon Islands want protection and security and so they ask China.

It reminds me of Ukraine asking to enter NATO for the same reasons.

Russia does not like the plan for Ukraine to find security in NATO. Russia wants Ukraine to be neutral and lay low because it does not want NATO missiles in its backyard.

This situation reminds me of the USA, Australia, and New Zealand not liking China's missiles in their areas (backyard) in the Solomon Islands.

What Russia is doing we all know it, poor Ukraine. What will Australia, NZ, USA do? We do not know it yet. What we know is that they are not happy at all and they said it loud and clear. They will certainly plan what to do. They will not take it sitting down. Is the Solomon Islands provoking its big neighbors who have been supportive to us so far? Are we sure this is the top priority of our country now? Was it not enough to have two superpowers fighting in our country (in our very homes, not our backyard) 70 years ago? Are we trying to get into a new trap where two or more superpowers will throw bombs at each other at Henderson or at Visale again?

We are a peace-loving people. Let us just eliminate corruption and our local quarrels and let the projects for the development of the country take off, without money going to individual pockets.

Can we not do it ourselves if we get rid of corruption and work hard as a team? With our own power and some support from traditional and new allies? Without delegating our own rights to self-defense to anyone, especially to any country that does not seem to respect democracy in their own country.

We can improve and manage with our present allies, can't we? It will be a tough road, going upwards without shortcuts: education, (more technical than academic...) respect for God, people, and nature, our common home, with hard work and brotherly relationships with every people on earth, neutral and free from the interference of foreign superpowers with their big guns... from anywhere.

There will be hard work to be done, but we will keep our freedom from pressures, our sovereignty, and dignity as a small Nation proud of itself.

I am Bishop Luciano Capelli, in the country for 23 years at North East Guala first during the ethnic tension (Don Bosco Henderson and Tetera RTC and GSH) and in Gizo since the earthquake of April 2, 2007. I feel like a Solomon Islander with a heart made in Italy. I have done my piece for the country and in my last year before retirement, I also feel I have to say my piece about this deal in this my country and people by adoption whom I dearly love.

Our best security is our culture, our faith, our resilience, our working together we firmly believe in this.

We have a pandemic to face, with serious effects on our life and economy. This issue is a strongly dividing issue. We need to be solid in unity now more than ever to face the pandemic which it appears so many of us take so lightly.

Would it not be wiser to give this deal a second thought? To see what the Sovereign Solomon Islands people really feel about it in a popular referendum or any other democratic way?

God save our Solomon Islands from shore to shore...the people, the land...and the sea.

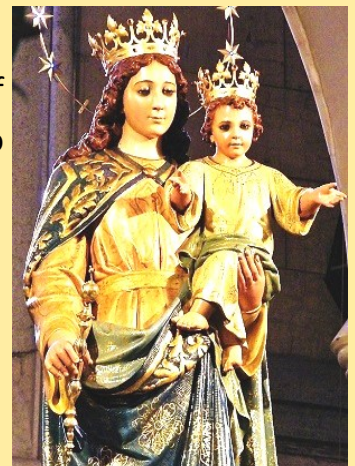
My brothers and sisters, this pandemic has also challenged our pastoral programs of the diocese for this year 2022.

### Priest Meeting on Synodality ended with Chrism Mass

12 Parish priests from the Catholic Diocese of Gizo are now completing their yearly meeting this 4th May 2022 at Bethania Gizo.

A meeting aiming their closeness with God and each other, and exceptional planning to analyze all the responses from all parishes on the actual situation of the Diocese of Gizo, regarding the Synodality and the evaluation of the 2005 Assembly with the 11 Recommendations.

(The meeting is specially initiated after a strong recommendation from the Holy Father, the episcopal conference of PNG and SI to take part in the preparation of the synod for the universal church in Rome in October 2023. The recently concluded priests' meeting last year 2021 decided on the plan to follow and asked the pastoral team to come up with questions to use to make everyone aware and participate in the synod).

The priests are here to pray, reflect, share and listen. They also have presentations, discussions, and making decisions.

They also have the privileged to listen to the Synodality reports from the parishes, they evaluate and have discussions.

These priests are from the eight parishes of the diocese of Gizo (Choiseul, Shortland, and Noro in the Western Province).

During the closing, the priests and the parishioners are celebrating the Chrism Mass, (Blessing of the Holy Anointing/Consecrated Oil) went successful at the St. Peters Cathedral Gizo in the midst of the covid-19 outbreak.

Sr. Anna described it as a very prayerful and uniting moment for all the priests of the diocese, she congratulated the liturgical group who, despite of the very small number, made everyone sing and participate joyfully.

COMMUNION, PARTICIPATION, MISSION, the theme that will be adopted into the diocese to

enlighten God's people through His Words in prayer and everyone to follow the path to which God calls us –deeper COMMUNION, fuller PARTICIPATION, and greater openness to fulfilling the MISSION in the world.

St. Dominic Parish last month has staged its implementation of a program on the call from the Holy Father Pope Francis that all Catholic faithful participates in the preparation of the Bishops Synod on the Synodality for the universal Church, that will be held in Rome, October 2023.

During that month of March eight groups consisting of three people made a two days visit to villages in the parish giving out awareness talks on the key message, based on the theme, Communion Participation, and Mission.

To comply with the key message; the 11 recommendations that were implemented in the diocese almost 18 years past were evaluated. People take much interest when evaluating, because it allows them to see progress our diocese and parishes endured in the past years up to the present time.

During the sharing and answering some of the questions provided, people came to realize how to live as Catholic faithful, and the activity is challenging them to improve their Christian lives.

After completing the visits, the eight groups come together on the 6th and 7th of April to evaluate the report they have collected during their visits.

### Devine Mercy, Moli Program



The covid-19 outbreak is here in other parts of the communities around our province. Nevertheless, the parish has to look ahead to its program for the year.

Prayers have still kept the parishioners going, which also keeps the Divine Mercy group coming up.

Reported from Moli parish, parish media volunteer Mr. Anthony Telavai said that the group celebrated the Divine mercy Sunday at Moli mission station. He said that though things are not normal, prayer is a powerful tool to overcome negative challenges face by the globe today.



## HOLY WEEK AND EASTER CHRIST THE KING PARISH

We are all trying to cope with difficulties in order to live a normal life in the midst of the impact of covid19. The pandemic has swept across the globe, since we are part of the global village, we are not exempted. Trying to cope with the pandemic has proven to be difficult. Our food security is threaten, we are faced with a danger of starvation, sources of our livelihood have soured. Many, if not most food gardens may not be able to sustain the need of food that used to be supplemented by food from shops. Basic needs are becoming harder and harder



that are satisfied by manufactured goods, at the same time are becoming expensive and difficult to have them transported to our villages. Ship owners are nervous because there are restrictions imposed upon them from travelling between the islands, hence are losing money.

Medical supplies and related needs have been badly affected, schools have closed their doors. Sadly conditions of our rural clinics and health centers are feeling the pinch. Either we have medicine in store or not, worse still we have no nurses in many of our rural clinics that are empty of staff. Patients are left to work for their own survival. We do not even have Panadol and Malaria tablets in our rural clinics and health centers. For a long time now, northwest Choiseul in particular, Varisi area, have had no nurses for more than a year or so. People are worried as to what the government has in store for them. They feel being neglected and have no reason to expect some assistance. Where will they go next is a question cannot be answered. It is a sad situation, it shouldn't have been this way at all.

Despite all these turmoil, people have been very prayerful. Above is the Stations of the Cross at Sariana Village, people did not mind at all following Jesus on the way to Calvary under the rain. Some had umbrellas while the rest were prepared to have showers over them. Children had been wonderful and were very happy to be part of the community in prayer. On the left is Voruvoru station on Easter Sunday where Mass was held outside in the open air to allow people practice social distancing. The whole atmosphere was filled with the beautiful melody coming out from youth choir with Bamboo Band being the background of singing. After Mass, everybody retreated to their homes to continue observing the restrictions of movements and other activities following rules set up by the government.

St. Peters Cathedral has a peaceful Holy week celebration that commenced on Palm Sunday.

He reminded everyone of the new covenant, a relationship established by Jesus Christ that we always celebrated on the Altar (Jesus' Body, and His Blood).

His message reminds people that we must not be slavery to sins, but must be free and allowed Jesus into our hearts.

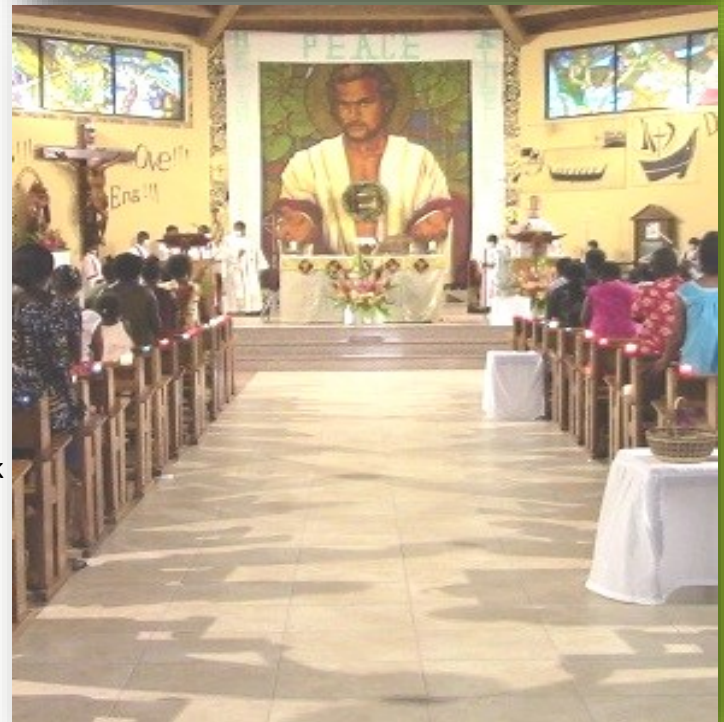
His homily message on Easter Sunday the Resurrection day reminds everyone that Jesus' Resurrection brings us hope, and faith.

His message continues to remind parents to evangelize and educate their children rather than raise them with no proper moral support. He said that Education and Evangelization are the first responsibility of a parent.

In his conclusion message, he asked the Lord for strength for everybody and to let Easter be for each and everybody, faith and life renewal.





## Covid-19 Respond, Good Samaritan AHC Center Nila.

From 5/02/2022 since the AHC Emergency Operation Center in Nila Shortland, the swabbing team received the RAT kid until 9/04/2022; the team tested three hundred and thirty-five (335) samples in which the total positive cases stands at thirty-seven (37). The rest was negative, reporter is Moses Lamani a Registered Nurse at the center.

He said that no covid 19 deaths and no severe cases has been reported in Zone 5 (Shortlands) and no covid 19 admission as well.

“Since the detection of the Virus here in Zone 5 at Toumoa village none of the health workers in Zone 5 was infected except a Nurse Aid and now she recovered”.

“The swabbing team received a request call from Kariki, Aleang, and Nuhu to visit them to do swabbing at their communities, however, due to the Shortage of RAT kids the team didn't make it but preserved those remaining RAT kits to be used at the clinic,” said the health staff.

He said that others have experienced the covid-19 virus is commonly like flu and

they said that there's no need for swabbing or to isolate people. This led to most people were not afraid of the Covid-19 virus, and now the Malaria cases were slightly increasing.

There has been a shortage of drugs, and they are still follow-ups for their orders, said Moses

However, there have been threats regarding border issues and others who stopped others from not using masks and getting swaps, but the registered nurse has sincerely registered his acknowledgment to all responsible staff and other key people in their community who assist in one way or the other , in time of covid-19 outbreak to serve the nation.

**Vaccines**

**2. AstraZeneca Vaccine (DNA Vaccine)**

The AZ vaccine enters our body cells, stays outside and needs to enter our nucleus.

When it enters our nucleus it uses the mechanism in the nucleus and produces the mRNA like for a Pfizer vaccine.

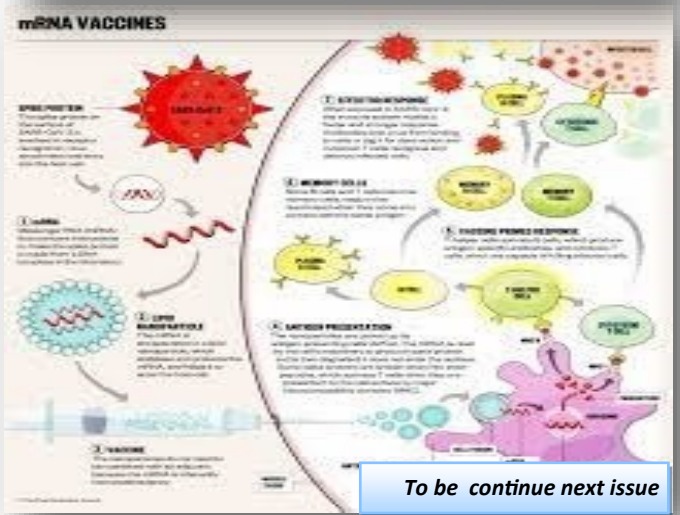
The mRNA is released from the nucleus into our cytoplasm where we have the ribosome. And the ribosome is responsible to accept the mRNA to read information and produce the Spike proteins.

By the way, the AstraZeneca vaccine never comes into contact or harms the DNA, because of the way they prepared the vaccine.

They will never, and be always never joining together, which I mean; IT NEVER TOUCHES OR CHANGE ANYTHING IN OUR DNA. And again the vaccine cannot destroy our body cells. Eventually, these two vaccines work in a similar

way.

Note: Unvaccinated people make up the vast majority of adult Covid-19 hospitalizations. (A study of 13 states over a period of six months shows; unvaccinated 87%, vaccinated less than 14 days 5.8 %, partially vaccinated 5.7%, and fully vaccinated 4.0%.
